- Only use money you can afford to lose

Signs of Problem Gambling

- · Constantly thinking or talking about gambling
- · Gambling until your last dollar is gone, spending more than intended, or borrowing money to gamble
- · Lying about wins, losses, or time spent gambling
- · Feeling defensive, guilty, or arguing when asked about gambling
- -Gambling to escape other problems
- · Skipping school, work, or time with friends and family to gamble

The difference between traditional games and gambling:

Traditional Games: Games establish connections and relationships between tribes and families.

Gambling: Gambling is usually an individual activity and is age restricted.

Traditional Games: Games play a role in ceremonies and celebrations.

Gambling: Games are still used in ceremonies and celebrations; however when money is wagered, we risk losing the value and meaning of the ceremony or celebration.

Traditional Games: Games teach skills of concentration and memory and develop physical stamina and ability.

Gambling: Most forms of gambling today do not involve skill and none develop physical stamina.

Traditional Games: Games play with the concept of the trickster and promote laughter and lightheartedness.

Gambling: Because of the risk of losing money or other valuables, there is very little laughter or lightheartedness associated with gambling.

Traditional Games: Games develop character, honour and integrity.

Gambling: Gambling is risking money (or other valuables) on an activity of chance where money may be won or lost. It takes time and money, not integrity.
